Well, another day and another dollar...Another month another article to the members...Oh, I forgot, I retired, no more dollars.

Christmas has passed and we can't wait for Christmas again. We had another white elephant sale and it was again different & successful... thank you all, for your items to sell & your buying of those items. We look forward to the next white elephant sale and more can't pass up items.

I have been asked a number of times about how I am able to setup a village of seventy, eighty, ninety, or more houses in just a couple days...well...in a nut shell or just one word...Stupidity!

I tend to have the same problems as everyone else. What should I set up? Where should I set it up when I figure out What? And then when do I find time to actually do the setup? It makes everyone else curious when they hear that the final activity was started and finished in One, Two or three days but the truth is what everyone knows. We (I) have been procrastinating due to biting off too much and then find I have very little time and spend many long hours planning and doing on the fly. I hope that answers everyone's questions but I probably should add a little more to the explanation.

After many years of attempting to make a village I have developed a number of standard methods and actions that make it possible to navigate the process which in turn helps me be able to complete the process in a shorter amount of time than when I first started to build villages.

Now don't pass this on as it is proprietary information. It all starts with storage. I have very specific areas to store the different items. I built a storage shed many years ago and while it is now very full, I have each village stored in its own area. That makes it faster to find the items I may want to use. Likewise, I have accessories sorted and stored in areas by village. Trees, I have a large area of our attic that is dedicated to just trees and they are arranged by style and /or size. I built another shed that holds platforms and styrofoam. While it may look completely different each and every time I set up a village the fact is the platforms are basically the same every year. This makes it quicker to setup the support as there is just a little modification rather than a whole new platform. And yes, I make all my own platforms.

When it comes to actually laying in the houses, I first stage the houses, mentally layout general ideas in my head like how many churches, am I using a theme, or are there special effects like a train, water, or mountains. I then stage the accessories and trees. Once I have pulled everything I think I am going to use I begin the task of covering the platform with Styrofoam to provide for the ability to hide cords and provide for elevations. Then comes the unboxing and placing houses. One thing I do not do is maintain accessories with respective houses. They are free to roam. You may find a blacksmith in front of a church but the concern is that I have enough people & accessories to make it look like they are alive. On a very large layout this process is repeated for each section as the platform is extended. The other thing I try to do as I go is to use multi light cords and bury the cords in the Styrofoam as I go. Last, I place trees and snow, (almost all my villages are snow bound). So you learned nothing new except that I panic and do what you do in just two days. Then Barbara looks and says no, put that there, and why did you do that...and I am done. In the end it is just my perseverance that makes it happen. And you, the viewer, wonder how did he do that in just two days.



NEW PRODUCTS...New Ideas!


